Forecast is breaking new ground in the promotion of young talents and offering audiences insights into artistic production processes in a diverse variety of genres. As an international platform for knowledge transfer, Forecast gives young talents from all over the world the opportunity to realize their own projects with the support of renowned mentors.

More than 360 applicants from 70 countries responded to the international call for proposals and submitted their project ideas to Forecast. The mentors Markus Diebel (design), Lars Petter Hagen (composition), Eric Joris (scientific fiction), Jürgen Mayer H. (architecture), Bas Princen (photography) and Barbara Vanderlinden (curating), will now offer 30 participants the opportunity to introduce themselves to the public at the Forecast Forum between August 28 and 30 at the Haus der Kulturen der Welt (HKW) in Berlin. The HKW will become a test lab and backdrop for their project proposals and invite the public to experience the presentations as concerts, videos and installations. In a series of conversations, the participants and mentors will address contemporary issues in their respective fields thus making Forecast a shared space to come together and exchange views.
